Mental Health Support Line - Help for Patients and Carers

Mental health support is now available to Derbyshire residents of all ages through a new mental health support line run by Derbyshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust. It is a free phone number and calls from landlines or mobiles should be free. The support line is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

The mental health support line is for Derbyshire people of all ages who are experiencing increased mental health needs during the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. This includes

- people who are currently supported by Derbyshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust with their ongoing mental health needs
- the carers of those currently being supported by Derbyshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust
- other Derbyshire residents who are experiencing increased distress or anxiety at this time

The mental health support line will provide support to people who are in immediate distress, or help their families or carers to seek support. During the call you will be supported by an experienced mental health practitioner who will make every effort to support you over the phone, or signpost you to available services or resources. Flu jabs for Carers

Unpaid carers can get a free NHS flu jab. In order to be eligible you'll need to receive Carer's Allowance or be the main carer of an older or disabled person whose welfare would be at risk if you became ill. Once you've been vaccinated against the flu, you're less likely to pass the virus onto the person you care for. Tell your GP practice you are a carer and ask about getting the flu jab.



Carers rights Day, 26th November 2020



The theme for this year's Carers Rights Day is **'Know your Rights'**. Carers need to know their rights whenever they are

in their caring journey: whether that is a workplace, in a healthcare setting, at home or when interacting with professionals. Carers Rights Day is about empowering carers with information and support so they can feel confident when they ask for what they need. There will be online events, information sharing and social media activity to celebrate and recognise carers on this day.

Derby City - Universal Services for Carers

Learning Disability Health Checks

The Learning Disability Carers Community has found that people with learning disabilities, living with their families, are less likely to have their yearly health check with their GP. The health checks are important as they pick up health problems before they become serious, and can help with support from other services. All Derbyshire doctors undertake these checks and it is free, just contact the GP and request one.

People with learning disabilities and their carers are entitled to a free flu jab. If the person you care for is scared of the needle then ask your GP about the nasal spray.

New Autism Advice and Information Service available in Derbyshire

April 2020 saw the launch of a new Autism and Advice Service for people living in Derbyshire. The service is free for people age over 16 diagnosed with Autism. The service also supports carers, parents and affiliates of people living with Autism as well as professionals seeking to become more Autism aware.



The service offers a telephone helpline which operates 9.30am - 4.30pm, Monday to Friday and new website with downloadable information and guides, a monthly newsletter, training and awareness raising and well as an opportunity to be part of the Autism Alliance, which is a meeting between professionals and people with lived experience.
